MAMRT in Winnipeg

Winnipeg Sanatorium/Concordia Hospital was built between 1911 and 1912 near mineral springs on the banks of the Red River. In 1933 was acquired by the Mennonite Hospital Society Concordia and relocated several times until present location on Concordia Ave opened in 1974.

The Grace Hospital was founded in 1890 by the Salvation Army, expanded and relocated over the years, transferred to Winnipeg Regional Health Authority in 2008.

Seven Oaks General Hospital was founded in 1981.

Victoria General Hospital was founded in 1911.

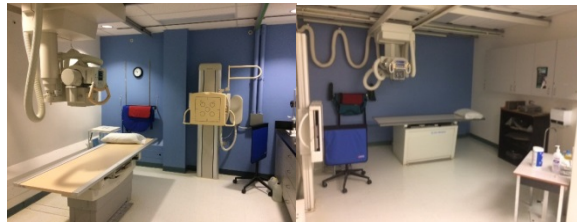
